PURPOSE:

Fulfill our pledge to the most vulnerable among San Francisco's children as they grow up and make life choices.

FINANCIAL GOAL: \$38 million **RAISED TO DATE:** \$35 million

GOALS FOR YOUTH:

- Positively, significantly, and measurably impact the lives of tens of thousands of San Francisco youth in the coming decade.
- Ensure that Club members graduate from high school and become contributing members of the community.
- Ensure that Club members are college-bound, job-ready, or enrolled in a trade school when they graduate from high school.

CAMPAIGN ELEMENTS:

- **Build.** Re-construct three of our nine Clubhouses: Willie Mays Boys & Girls Club at Hunters Point; Mission Clubhouse; Ernest Ingold Clubhouse (Western Addition). Renovate Camp Mendocino, our residential summer camp.
- **Strengthen programs and services** (Education Initiative, Mental Health Services, Teen Campaign, scholarships, leadership programs, and job opportunities)
- **Build endowment** to support the highest quality staff and increased numbers of youth served (to 1,400 every day after school and 2,000 every day in summer).
